CLINIC STATS

16 clinic sessions as of May 2021

29 unique patients seen in Down syndrome clinic

46 patient visits

125 arrived visits

8 babies under age two are followed in the infant clinic 51 total individuals seen at our center age 40 to 2 months

FUNDING and LOGISTICS

REDCap database established with \$10,000 Sears grant trust funding.

Children's Miracle Network Funding: \$5,000 grant.


Thompson Center hosts the clinic as it has has a mission to support interdisciplinary care for children with neurodevelopmental disabilities. MU Health care and the Thompson center provide the clinical support.

Administrative time is being utilized by endocrinologist and developmental pediatric team members at this time to start this clinic until volumes are more consistent.

Speech language department obtains authorization and bills for the speech language evaluation.

Pediatric ophthalmology integrates patients from Down syndrome clinic into a modified existing clinic in order to have expected productivity.


Clinic coordinator has multiple roles and coordinating this clinic was added to her work load.






Hypothyroidism 59% 17/29

Overweight or obese 57%






CO-OCCURRING ASD

3 individuals currently have a formal diagnosis of autism with an additional 3 that have a suspected diagnosis and have been referred for formal testing. MCHAT screening, STAT, RITA-T.

OBSTRUCTIVE SLEEP APNEA



Average AHI is 21 with a range of 0.63 to 67 10/29 have had T&A

We have 3 individuals who have been prescribed CPAP. Compliance is 0 hours per night for 2 and one child will tolerate an average of 2 hours per night.

DISCUSSION

Children with Down syndrome have medical needs that require vigilance. Having a dedicated team is important.

Audiology to start coming to the center in August.

Pulmonary is the next provider type we anticipate adding.

Having a dedicated clinic has given us the opportunity to increase communication with regional Down syndrome organization Down Syndrome Innovations.

We have been able to partner with KUMC to recruit for NIH funded DS Determined study

We have recorded a podcast about the clinic and communication needs of children with Down syndrome Improved educational materials for families.

Due to our location within an established autism center we have opportunities for partnerships with ABA providers, therapists and psychologists.

A single clinic space with access to the specialized equipment needed by subspecialists is a challenge. Initially we had patients were going to 4 different locations in our health system within 4 hours.

ENT had to bow out of this clinic early on due to high clinical demands and scheduling conflicts.

Due to demand we have expanded the clinic to accommodate a total of 6 children in a half day session.

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
